

Director's Note:

One of the biggest struggles I have encountered in selecting a play each fall is finding one with more than a few female characters, let alone substantial female characters. Since 'GERLL Power' is very much alive at Molloy since the creation of the Girl's Empowerment for Real Life Leadership Club, the 1st Annual Fashion Show, and a scholarship fund for female students this past year, it seemed appropriate to find a way to keep the momentum going. Louisa May Alcott's classic "Little Women" is a story that is seemingly simple: the plight of a wife and her four daughters in the absence of their husband/father who has gone off as a minister during the Civil War. Women in the 1860's traditionally were not empowered compared to the way that women are today, but the March women show that being opinionated, strong-willed, and ceaseless' in their faith and love for each other is something to be celebrated.

Adapted numerous times (and about to be once again in December for the big screen), <u>Little Women</u> is a story which has resonated with readers since its publication 150 years ago. Whether it's Amy's spunky spirit, Beth's quiet tenderness, Jo's unapologetic wit, or Meg's patience and conviction, everyone can relate to at least one of these "little women," who are little because their childhoods and young adulthoods overlap as they come of age. Alcott's original story was written in two volumes – only the first is the subject of Clapham's play. Volume One follows a year in the life of the March girls and the hardships, heartaches, trials, and triumphs they endure. This play limits the action of the story to the March's living room, showing the comings and goings of all of the characters. I am so pleased by how these students have embodied these characters from centuries ago and have found ways to breathe new life into them and make them relatable to a modern audience.

This show marks a major milestone of mine since becoming director of the Stanner Players 6 years ago: taking on the role of set designer. My long time set expert, Todd Wilkerson, recently retired to Kentucky, leaving me to hope that he taught me well enough to do it on my own. I will say that the task of building something out of nothing was extremely daunting, but with major help from Dyana Christie and Jessica Pastore, we got the set you see before you built, standing, and stable. I am eternally grateful to them and am humbled to know that all I need to do is ask for help and they will be there wielding power tools and encouragement. I look forward to future collaborations with them.

As always, I must take a moment to say a huge thank you to several people: to my team of Glenn and Gary, without whom none of this would have been possible. To Kim Cipriano for agreeing to work the lobby for one last show before a taking a temporary hiatus in the spring to welcome her first child (a future Stanner of the Class of 2038!) To Matt Waldron for set consultation and support! To Darius Penikas and Richard Karsten for their continued support of Molloy's Theater Program. To Jonathan DiDonato, Heather Green-Wresch, and Edwidge Turenne in the Admissions Office for helping to organize the opportunity for 8th grade students to come and view our final dress rehearsal. To our Administration and Faculty for your guidance and kind words of support throughout this process. To my students for bearing with me during this extremely busy time! To all of The Parents of the Players (PoPs) for feeding us during dress rehearsals, and for their patience, understanding, and support – thank you for enabling your children to put on this show! To anyone I may have specifically forgotten to single out, I truly apologize and thank you wholeheartedly! And finally, to my co-workers, friends, and family for their continued love and support of my passion.

To quote Louisa May Alcott, "The humblest tasks get beautified if loving hands do them." This show is beautiful because of all the lovely hands that have worked so humbly on it. I truly love, admire, and respect every member of this cast and crew and am privileged to be entrusted with such precious charges.
